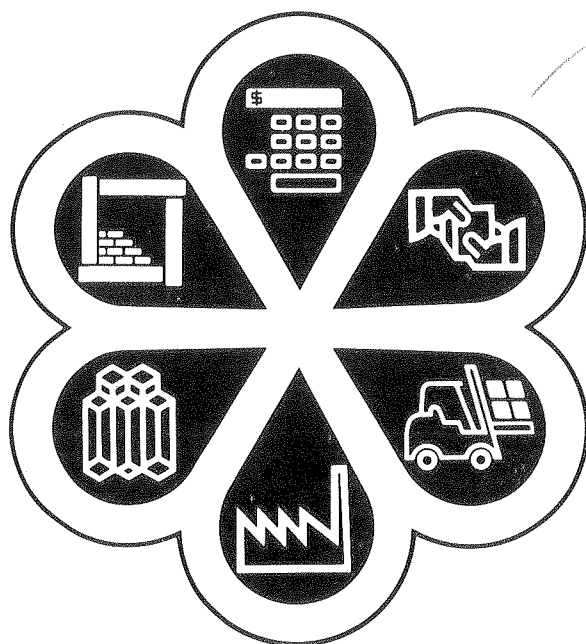

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ECONOMIC CENSUSES OVER TIME

The early beginnings of America's industrial output were first measured in the United States in the 1810 Decennial Census and again in 1820, when questions on manufacturing were included with those for population. Beginning with the 1840 Decennial Census, there were enumerations of manufactures and mineral industries at 10-year intervals up to and including the year 1900 for manufactures and 1940 for mineral industries.

Because of the increasing dominance of manufacturing in the early 20th century, Congress directed that quinquennial censuses of manufactures be taken beginning in 1905. However, from 1919 through 1939, these censuses were conducted every 2 years. The need for war-related current surveys in the early 1940's postponed the next census of manufactures until 1948 (for 1947).

Retail and wholesale trade data were first collected in 1930, and in 1933 information on selected service industries was added to the data-collection operation. These business censuses, as they were called, were again taken for 1935, 1939 (as part of the 1940 decennial program), and 1948.

Information on construction industries was first obtained in 1930 and again for 1935 and 1939.

An integrated economic census program was begun in 1954 covering the censuses of retail and wholesale trade, selected service industries, manufactures, and mineral industries. These censuses previously had been taken on an independent basis. The enterprise statistics program, which publishes combined data from the economic censuses, was made possible with the implementation of the integrated economic census program in 1954. Subsequent integrated economic censuses were taken covering the years 1958, 1963, and 1967. The census of construction industries, suspended during World War II like the censuses of business, manufactures, and mineral industries, was not resumed until 1967 when it was added to the integrated program. Beginning with the 1967 censuses, Congress authorized the economic censuses to be taken at 5-year intervals covering years ending in "2" and "7".

The need for transportation data to supplement information available from existing governmental or private sources was recognized by Congress in the late 1950's and early 1960's. The census of transportation (consisting of several surveys) was first taken for 1963 and again for 1967.

Since 1967, all of the above censuses have been taken quinquennially as part of the Census Bureau's economic census program. (For the 1977 censuses, the coverage of the service industries was broadened from "selected services" to all services,

except religious organizations and private households. A total of 41 additional four-digit standard industrial classifications¹ (SIC's) in 7 SIC major groups was added to the scope of the census. While most of the industries included for the first time for 1977 were covered again for 1982, some were not, i.e., hospitals; elementary and secondary schools; colleges, universities, and professional schools; junior colleges and technical institutes; labor unions; and political organizations.)

The first manufacturing census for an outlying area was conducted in Puerto Rico for the year 1909. Thereafter, with the exception of 1929, a census was taken at 10-year intervals through 1949. The first censuses of retail trade, wholesale trade, and selected service industries in Puerto Rico were conducted for 1939. These censuses also were taken for the years 1949, 1954, 1958, 1963, and 1967. A census of construction industries was first introduced in Puerto Rico for 1967. These censuses of Puerto Rico have been taken since then for the years 1972, 1977, and 1982.

Censuses of manufactures, retail trade, wholesale trade, and selected service industries were conducted in Guam and the Virgin Islands of the United States for 1958, 1963, 1967, 1972, 1977, and 1982. Censuses of mineral industries were taken in the Virgin Islands of the United States for the years 1958, 1963, and 1967 but not since that time. A census of construction industries was also undertaken in these areas for 1972, 1977, and 1982.

Retail trade, wholesale trade, selected service industries, manufacturing, and construction industries were canvassed for the first time in the Northern Mariana Islands in 1983 (for 1982).

The surveys of minority-owned business enterprises and women-owned businesses have been included as special programs of the economic censuses since 1977. The first survey of minority-owned businesses was done in 1969 and then in 1972. The survey of women-owned businesses was initially done in 1972.

For 1982, the economic censuses and agriculture census were conducted concurrently.

USES OF THE ECONOMIC CENSUSES

The economic censuses are the major source for facts about the structure and functioning of the Nation's economy and provide essential information for government, business, industry, and the general public. They provide an important part of the framework for such composite measures as the gross national product, input-output measures, indexes of industrial production, and indexes measuring productivity and price levels. Information from the censuses is used to establish sampling frames and as benchmarks for current surveys of business activity, which are essential for measuring short-term economic conditions.

State and local governments use census data to assess business activities within their jurisdictions. The private sector uses the data to forecast general economic conditions; analyze sales performance; lay out sales territories; allocate funds for advertising; decide on locations for new plants, warehouses, or stores; and measure potential markets in terms of size, geographic areas, kinds of business, and kinds of products made or sold.

Following every census, thousands of businesses and other users purchase reports. Likewise, census facts are widely disseminated by trade associations, business journals, and newspapers. Volumes containing census statistics are available in most major public and college libraries. All 1982 data are available on microfiche from the U.S. Government Printing Office and most data on computer tape from the Census Bureau. Finally, the more than 50 State Data Centers also are suppliers of economic censuses statistics.

AUTHORITY AND SCOPE OF THE ECONOMIC CENSUSES

The economic censuses are required by law under title 13 of the United States Code, sections 131, 191, and 224, which directs that they be taken at 5-year intervals for the years ending in 2 and 7. The 1982 Economic Censuses covered manufacturing, mining, construction industries, retail trade, wholesale trade, service industries, and selected transportation activities. Special programs also cover minority-owned and women-owned businesses. The next economic censuses are scheduled to be taken in 1988 for the year 1987.

METHOD OF ACCOUNTING AND TIME COVERED

For the census report, respondents could use any system of accounting by which they maintained their books. Therefore, reports could be based on cash, accrual, or completion of contract methods of accounting.

A report was supposed to cover the calendar year 1982. If that involved considerable costs, fiscal year reporting was permitted if it did not produce great differences. However, all payroll and employment figures had to be reported for the calendar year.

ENTERPRISE STATISTICS

General

The 1982 Enterprise Statistics is a series of publications based on data collected in the 1982 Censuses of Distributive Trades and Service Industries, Manufactures, Mineral Industries, Construction Industries, and Agriculture. These reports include: "General Report on Industrial Organization" and "Auxiliary Establishment Report."

The publication, "General Report on Industrial Organization", is based on responses from the many different 1982 Economic Censuses report forms. Each of the economic census questionnaires include several general questions such as kind of business, dollar volume of business, number of employees, amount of payroll, and company affiliation. The questions on the agriculture census questionnaires that coincide with the economic census questions are employment, annual payroll, and dollar volume of business. The resulting tables furnish comprehensive data on the industrial organization and significant patterns of structural

change of all census reporting firms and the establishments they own or control. Additionally a separate economic census report form is sent to large companies with 500 employees or more. The resulting tables show selected financial statistics of large companies.

The publication, "Auxiliary Establishment Report", presents data on separately reported auxiliary units of multiestablishment firms. The primary functions of these establishments are to manage, administer, service, or support the activities of the other establishments of the company. The tables furnish detailed financial statistics of auxiliaries by industry classification of the owning company, industry classification of the operating establishments they service, the type of management or supporting service function they provide, their employment size, and their geographic location.

Scope

The 1982 Enterprise Statistics program covered manufacturing, mining, construction industries, distributive trades, selected service industries, and agricultural production (only included in the "General Report on Industrial Organization"). This was essentially the same as the scope of the economic censuses, except the censuses included certain transportation services and a broader range of service industries.

How the Data are Presented

This publication examines the characteristics of auxiliaries that were reported separately by multiestablishment industrial and business firms covered in the 1982 Economic Censuses. The data for auxiliaries are distributed by the industry of the owning companies, the industry of the establishments they serve, the type of management or service they provide, their employment size, and their geographic location.

SPECIAL TABULATIONS

Special tabulations of 1982 Enterprise Statistics data may be obtained on computer tape or in tabular form. The data will be in summary form and subject to the same rules prohibiting disclosure of confidential information (such as name, address, kind of business, or other data for individual business establishments or companies) as are the regular publications.

Special tabulations are prepared on a cost basis. A request for a cost estimate, as well as exact specifications on the type and format of the data to be provided, should be directed to the Chief, Economic Surveys Division, Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C. 20233.

APPENDIX A.

Explanation of Terms

ANNUAL PAYROLL

Annual payroll is defined as the combined amount of wages paid, tips reported, and other compensation including salaries, vacation allowances, bonuses, commissions, sick-leave pay and the value of payments in kind (such as free meals and lodging) paid to all employees before deductions for social security, income tax, insurance, union dues, etc. All forms of compensation are included, whether or not subject to income tax or FICA tax, with the exception of annuities, third party sick pay, and supplemental unemployment compensation benefits (even if income tax was withheld). For corporations, total payroll includes compensation paid to officers and executives; for unincorporated businesses, it does not include profit or other compensation or proprietors or partners.

Payroll also includes the value of payments in kind (such as free meals and lodgings received by employees from their employers) and gratuities received by employees from patrons. The amounts paid to officers and executives of corporations are included as payroll, however, the profit or other compensation of proprietors or partners of unincorporated companies is not considered payroll. Total compensation is not the same as annual payroll, as it includes the employer's contribution to fringe benefits.

CAPITAL EXPENDITURES

Capital expenditures are defined as all expenditures made during the year for which depreciation accounts are ordinarily maintained. Expenditures for new additions and alterations to plant, new machinery and equipment used for replacement or additions, and used plant and machinery acquired from others are considered capital expenditures. Expenditures for new plants or machinery under construction that were not yet in operation during the census year, capital leases entered into after January 1, 1982, and expenditures for machinery rented to others also are included. Capital expenditures do not include expenditures for land and depletable assets or the cost of maintenance and repairs normally charged as current operating expenses.

AUXILIARIES

Auxiliaries are defined as establishments whose employees are primarily engaged in general and business administration; management; research, development, and testing; warehousing; electronic data processing; and other supporting services performed centrally for other establishments of the same company rather than for other companies or the general public.

Sales branches and sales offices of manufacturing and mining companies are not classified as auxiliaries, but as wholesale trade establishments. Similarly, auxiliaries do not include commercial laboratories engaged in research, development, and

testing of products for other business firms on a fee or contract basis; warehouses storing the goods of other firms; or trading stamp redemption centers that are operated for other companies selling the stamps.

A census establishment report (form ES-9200) was required for each auxiliary separately located from the establishments it served. A separate report was also requested if the auxiliary activity was carried on at the same location as one of the firm's establishments, provided it served two or more establishments and was not operated as an integral part of the establishment at the same location.

COMPANY

A company is a business organization consisting of one domestic establishment or more that the reporting firm specified under its ownership or control at the end of 1982. If a company owned or controlled other companies, all establishments of the subsidiaries are included as part of the owning or controlling company.

DEPRECIABLE ASSETS

Depreciable assets are defined as assets of an auxiliary for which depreciation and amortization accounts are ordinarily maintained. Depreciable assets are comprised of: (a) buildings and structures; and (b) machinery and equipment, and are stated at end-of-prior-year and end-of-current-year values.

The gross value of such assets represent the acquisition cost (original cost) to the auxiliary. These depreciable assets data include the value of all improvements and new construction in progress, but not yet completed at the end of the year. The value of machinery, equipment, buildings, structures, etc., owned by the auxiliary but leased or rented to others is also included.

DEPRECIATION

Depreciation is the process of allocating the cost of an asset to the period of benefit, or depreciation life of more than 1 year. Depreciation charged against assets acquired since the beginning of the year along with depreciation charged against assets sold or retired during the year are components of this category.

EMPLOYEES (NUMBER)

The total number of employees is the number of persons employed at the auxiliary for any part of the pay period including March 12th of the census reporting year. Salaried officers, and executives of corporations, along with employees on paid sick leave, paid holidays, and paid vacations are included in the employment figure. Employees working in or from other establishments of the company, even though paid from the auxiliary, are excluded. Also excluded are proprietors and partners of unincorporated businesses.

EMPLOYEES (BY TYPE OF WORK PERFORMED)

Employees by type of work performed represents the employment distribution by the following principal functions: administration; research, development, and testing; warehousing; electronic data processing; sales to customers directly from this location; and other activities. When the establishment records did not provide actual employee counts for the functions listed, an estimate was accepted. Employees performing a variety of functions are reported in their "primary" activity during the March 12th pay period, or allocated on some other reasonable and consistent basis. (It was on the basis of this distribution of employees by type of work performed that the principal function of the auxiliary was determined as described above.)

ENTERPRISE INDUSTRY CATEGORY

An enterprise industry category is a group of four-digit SIC industries that were specifically designed to relate to enterprises rather than to establishments. It is an adaptation of the four-digit SIC classification system to provide an industrial classification system that is meaningful in expressing consolidated company aggregates of the establishment data collected in the economic censuses. Enterprise industry categories are grouped to form industry divisions representing major sectors of the economy—construction, manufacturing, retail trade, etc.

ESTABLISHMENT

An establishment is defined in the economic censuses as a business or industrial unit at a single physical location which produces or distributes goods or performs services. A separate establishment report was obtained for each physical location at which a company carried on activities within the scope of the 1982 Economic Censuses. When distinct and separate economic activities were conducted under the same ownership at a single location, and when conditions prescribed by the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual¹ for recognizing the existence of more than one establishment were met, separate establishment reports were obtained for each activity.

In addition to preparing a report for each "operating" establishment, each company was asked to identify and report separately as "auxiliaries" those locations whose primary functions were to manage, administer, service, or support the activities of other establishments of the company. No company may consist exclusively of auxiliary establishments. A company must have at least one operating establishment which produces or distributes goods, or which performs services for the general public or for other business firms.

GEOGRAPHIC AREAS COVERED

General statistics are presented for auxiliaries for the United States as a whole and each individual State, including the District of Columbia.

INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION OF AUXILIARIES

Each auxiliary reported in the economic censuses was assigned a code based on the standard industrial classification¹ (SIC) of the establishments within the company for which the auxiliary performed supporting services.

In most instances, these "industry-serviced" codes represented major industry group (two-digit SIC) or industry group (three-digit SIC) levels of classification, rather than individual census industry (four-digit SIC) classifications, because the auxiliaries of the larger and more industrially diversified companies (which accounted for the bulk of auxiliary activities) typically served establishments classified in more than one census industry group or industry.

INVENTORIES

Inventories are defined as the balance of goods on hand, such as raw materials, supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods and merchandise on hand for resale. In the 1982 censuses, the inventory inquiry was designed to collect unduplicated, consolidated information concerning all of the inventories owned by the enterprises and which are located within the United States. Inventories of multiestablishment enterprises were reported by the establishment responsible for the inventories, even if these inventories were held at a separate location.

For 1977, auxiliaries were asked to report their method of valuation on a cost, market, retail or other basis. In 1982, auxiliaries were requested to report their inventories at cost or market using generally accepted accounting methods. Specifically, respondents were asked to report on a LIFO basis (LIFO reserve and LIFO value of inventories) and/or on a non-LIFO basis.

PRINCIPAL FUNCTION CLASSIFICATION OF AUXILIARIES

The principal function of each auxiliary is determined by the distribution of its employees among the functions specified in the 1982 ES-9200 forms, i.e., administration; research, development, and testing; warehousing; electronic data processing; sales to customers directly from this location; and other activities. Reports indicating that the largest number of employees were engaged in "sales to customers directly from this location" were usually reclassified, either as manufacturers' sales branches and sales offices or as retail stores. When the auxiliary reported its employees in two or more types of work, the functional category with the largest employment determined the principal function of the establishments.

SALES TO CUSTOMERS OUTSIDE THE COMPANY

Sales to customers outside the company include all merchandise sales, receipts for services to customers outside the company, and research and development contracts performed for Federal agencies or other companies by the reporting auxiliary during 1982. These sales exclude all excise and sales taxes that are paid directly to taxing agencies. Also excluded are transactions with other establishments of the owning company and any sales or receipts reported by other establishments of the owning company on their 1982 census report forms.

PUBLICATION PROGRAM

1982 ENTERPRISE STATISTICS

Publications of the 1982 Enterprise Statistics are described below. Publications order forms for the specific reports may be obtained from any Department of Commerce district office or from Data User Services Division, Customer Services (Publications), Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C. 20233.

The enterprise statistics program consists of summary tabulations of the data obtained from the various censuses (manufactures, mineral industries, distributive trades, service industries, construction industries, and agriculture industries) included within the scope of the 1982 Economic and Agriculture Censuses conducted by the Bureau of the Census. Similar programs were conducted in the 1954, 1958, 1963, 1967, 1972, and 1977 Economic Censuses. The economic and agriculture censuses were conducted concurrently for the first time in 1982.

Essentially, the enterprise statistics program involves aggregating the census data records of establishments that are under common ownership or control and assigning company codes to show various economic characteristics of the firms that own or control the establishments. Statistics for the enterprise-establishment relationships are tabulated by type of company organization, by company size, and by industry classification. Data are also cross tabulated to indicate company industrial diversification patterns. One special group of establishments, called auxiliaries, are examined in detail in a separate publication.

General Report on Industrial Organization—1 report (ES82-1)

This report presents data on structural patterns of American industrial organization in terms of the primary industrial activity of companies, their employment and sales size, industry specialization, and other economic characteristics for all 1982 census-reporting firms and the establishments they own or control. The enterprise classification system, similar to the standard industrial classification system, is used to determine company activity. Also included in this report are company-establishment cross

tabulations, showing the patterns of vertical integration and diversification among industrial and agricultural firms. Detailed financial data is presented for large companies only.

Auxiliary Establishment Report—1 report (ES82-2)

This report presents data on separately reported auxiliary units of multiestablishment firms covered in the 1982 Economic Censuses. Data for these special establishments are distributed by the industry classification of the owning company, the industry classification of the operating establishments they service, by the type of management or supporting service function they provide, by their employment size, and by their geographic location. Detailed statistics are provided to show their sales and receipts, end-of-year inventories, capital expenditures, and gross fixed assets for auxiliary establishments.

All published data are also available on microfiche.

OTHER ECONOMIC CENSUSES REPORTS

Data on retail trade, wholesale trade, service industries, construction industries, manufactures, mineral industries, transportation, minority-owned business enterprises, and women-owned businesses also are issued as part of the 1982 Economic Censuses. A separate series of reports covers the censuses of outlying areas—Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands of the United States, Guam, and the Northern Mariana Islands. Appropriate announcements and order forms describing these reports are available free of charge from Data User Services Division, Customer Services (Publications), Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C. 20233.

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
